# OVERVIEW OF PLAN CONCEPTS

- The commitment to complete 13 action items overlays 5 years from January 2018 to December 2022
- Action items are related to these goals:
  - Goal 1: Protect the lives and livelihoods of all citizens
  - Goal 2: Reduce the impact of disasters to property, infrastructure and the local economy
  - Goal 3: Ensure continued operation of government, emergency functions and critical infrastructure in a disaster
- Eight action items have been calendarized through 2021
- Five action items are by their nature ongoing and apply to each year

# PLAN ADMINISTRATION

- Given the timeframe of five years, it is not practical at this time to develop a detailed plan for each year showing dates and completion steps. Therefore, the following guidelines reflect a more general approach that will lead to a successful closure of each item.
- **Guidelines:**
  - In January of each year the relative action items for that year will be reviewed.
  - A detailed completion plan for each item will be constructed with assignments of responsibilities and due dates for completion.
  - Progress on the plan will be inserted quarterly into the monthly meeting agenda and reviewed.

# 2018 ACTION ITEMS

- Action 1 -- Use local and regional traditional media, and social media platforms, to raise awareness of mitigation activities
  - Prepare announcement to raise awareness in the community-Schortgen
  - Distribute via email to all residents-Village Clerk
- Action 2 -- Purchase and install NOAA weather radios in schools, government buildings, parks, etc.
  - Agree on location(s) and number of radio(s)-BOT
  - Buy radio(s) and install-Hinshaw



# 2018 ACTION ITEMS

- Action 3 -- Promote the use of NOAA weather radios by all residents and businesses
  - Prepare announcement on benefits and location(s) of radio(s)-Hinshaw
  - Distribute announcement via email to all residents-Village Clerk
- Action 4 -- Promote local severe weather alert applications for mobile communications devices
  - Include information related to Christian County **Swift 911** capability in announcement issued under Action 1 (**Swift 911 Public Mass Notification System** is a Christian county text service providing instantaneous notification related to a weather, road blockage, fire, other emergency situations, etc.)

# 2019 ACTION ITEMS

- Action 5 -- Create and update tornado/severe storm plans and identify strong, safe places in schools, large facilities, and other establishments serving the public
- Action 9 -- Educate importance of, and enforce visible 911 addressing

# 2020 ACTION ITEMS

- Action 10 -- Integrate hazard mitigation into comprehensive plans and storm water management policies

# 2021 ACTION ITEMS

- Action 8 -- Promote and provide National Incident Management System (NIMS) training and/or information for all elected officials, public administrators, . . . and community stakeholders
  - *NIMS guides all levels of government, nongovernmental organizations (NGO), and the private sector to work together to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from incidents. NIMS provides stakeholders across the whole community with the shared vocabulary, systems, and processes to successfully deliver the capabilities described in the National Preparedness System. NIMS defines operational systems, including the Incident Command System (ICS), Emergency Operations Center (EOC) structures, and Multiagency Coordination Groups (MAC Groups) that guide how personnel work together during incidents. NIMS applies to all incidents, from traffic accidents to major disasters.*



# ONGOING ITEMS CONSIDERED ANNUALLY

- Action 6 – **Enforce** floodplain management requirements
- Action 7 -- **Work with regulatory agencies** to obtain appropriate permits to maintain waterways in order to reduce the impact of flooding
- Action 11 -- **Continue to monitor and identify** funding from state and federal programs for hazard mitigation activities
- Action 12 -- Taney County and incorporated jurisdictions **continue coordination** to promote infrastructure development practices that reduce damage from flooding
- Action 13 -- **Continue development** of Geographic Information Systems (GIS) to further identify, analyze, and map hazard prone areas to enhance decision making and facilities management
